By his deeds, the Pope has demonstrated once more, that like his predecessors, he is “the servant of the servants of God,” the indefatigable defender of truth, the advocate of all men and women, whose dignity he believes in with all his might. Something much more important than his personal prestige is present here. In these 25 years John Paul II has made Christ present in our time, has brought mankind to find in Jesus the answer to the deep questions about human existence. Ultimately this is the source of his authority.
