Eleven of us started working together to send love to those who need it most.

Sending cards to frontline workers and many others...

The main aim of our campaign is to send out motivational cards to frontline workers, residents of long-term care facilities, patrons of a sandwich distribution group, seniors living alone as well as cancer patients.

We have sent thank you cards, letters and videos to over 1,000 frontline workers in Canada, United States, U.K., and Philippines who have contributed their expertise and skills to provide care for the people affected by the virus. We thank them for their hard work in making and providing a healthy environment for everyone during these trying times.

Our second group of card recipients were 276 residents of two long-term

care facilities. The elderly are the ones that are affected the most by this pandemic. Sometimes, they are unaware of what is happening in the world and think that their families and loved ones do not want to visit them. Thus, we made it part of our mission to make them feel loved and show that they are not forgotten through the little handwritten cards we send them. Seeing pictures of them smiling also gave us the hope and the motivation to continue our journey to put as many smiles on people as we could.

Our third group are patrons of community outreach programs in Toronto and Montreal that provide nutritious packed lunches for those in need on a regular basis. To show that they are loved, we decided to insert our handwritten cards in their bagged lunches. The words of encouragement on the cards are very well appreciated by the patrons as

they bring joy to their hearts. To date we have sent over 200 cards.

Lastly, we have sent over 100 cards to seniors living alone and cancer patients. We dedicate time to video call people who greatly appreciate having company and we also have started receiving food donations which we give to our local church.

Becoming a national campaign

What started as a little initiative in March with eleven people has now become an international campaign. We have over sixty-five family, friends and Kintore alumni helping us *Make This World A Better Place*. We work with like-minded people from all over Canada as well as from New Zealand and Brazil.
