After studying law at the University of Ottawa, Julio worked as a lawyer in Ottawa, Montreal and Toronto. In 2007 he moved to Rome to prepare for the priesthood and do a masters in Canon Law at the Pontifical university of the Holy Cross. After his

ordination he will stay in Rome to complete his doctorate in Canon law.
