Tackling poverty through education: Teresa's story.

The Macheo Achievement
Programme, an initiative of the
Community Service Centre of
Strathmore University, began in
February 2012. It helps secondary
school students from disadvantaged
neighborhoods navigate through
school to emerge stronger and well
equipped for life. Macheo, meaning
sunrise in Swahili, organizes AfterSchool and Holiday Programmes

which provide academic tutoring, personal mentoring and character development for these students. The students are drawn from eight secondary schools in Kibera, Mukuru and Kangeme in Nairobi.

As of this year (2018) there are one hundred and fifty secondary school students enrolled in the programme. Of the ones who finished secondary school more than forty are studying in Strathmore University and other colleges in Kenya. Strathmore University students are the tutors and mentors of the school boys and girls. Teresa is one such student who benefitted from Macheo and is now studying Communications in Strathmore University. This is her story.
